- Review and identify gaps in the status of underpinning science for selected forensic science disciplines.
- Complete a review of forensic science processes for Illicit Drug Analysis and Fingerprint Analysis to identify best practice and opportunities for process improvements.

- Review the National Familial DNA Searching Policy.

- Participate in the development and review of Australian forensic related standards.
- Participate in the development of international forensic related standards on behalf of the Australian community.

Ongoing activities

- Leverage resources in order to reduce costs to forensic science agencies for specialised training needs, and increase training opportunities for experts by providing funding and facilitation to ANZFEC approved workshops.
- Facilitate the Ian Riebeling New Practitioner Workshop held in conjunction with the Australian and New Zealand Forensic Science Society (ANZFSS) Symposium.

- Pilot the double blind system testing framework into the laboratory environment.
- Deliver a project to enhance AFSAB administration and processes.
- Complete a review of the After the Fact Commercialisation Project.
