

# ANZ International Representation Framework



## What is the Framework?

*The Framework provides:*

- A co-ordinated approach for notifying Australia New Zealand Forensic Executive Committee (ANZFEC) members and Specialist Advisory Group (SAG) Chairs of practitioner participation in international committees and working groups
- A feedback mechanism for key outcomes and learnings to be shared with the Australia New Zealand (ANZ) forensic science community in a timely manner

## Notification Process

*Applies to:*

- Requests received for ANZ forensic science practitioner participation in international committees and working groups (where the practitioner is required to provide an expert opinion and represent government service providers)

*Excludes:*

- Individual, specific invitations for plenary, keynote, conference presentations
- Instances where the practitioner plans to take personal leave to attend an event
- Activities co-ordinated through Australian Federal Police (such as INTERPOL requests)
- ISO Standards development committees (co-ordinated through Standards Australia)
- Requests for individual agency participation through bilateral agreements

*Practitioner responsibilities:*

- Complete the [ANZ International Representation Notification Form](#) prior to attendance

## Feedback Process

*Applies to:*

- Any practitioner who has been asked to provide feedback to the ANZ forensic science community on committee and working group outcomes, regardless of whether they represented ANZ or not

*Practitioner responsibilities:*

- Complete the [ANZ Forensic Science Practitioner Feedback Form](#) within one month of event attendance

*ANZFEC members and SAG Chair responsibilities:*

- Review practitioner feedback forms and ensure key outcomes and learnings are disseminated to the ANZ forensic science community as appropriate
